Durham College is seeking an experienced and motivated professional who shares our commitment to quality and student success. The School of Health & Community Services requires a full-time professor to teach in the Critical Care and Practical Nursing programs:

Critical Care – Neurological Nursing
Acute Medical – Surgical Nursing

Candidates must be available to teach classes Monday through Thursday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. and Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., during the January to August teaching cycle. Non-teaching and vacation occur between September and December.

The responsibilities of Durham College Professors include, but are not limited to:

1. Creating a positive learning environment that accommodate students' diverse cultural and educational backgrounds, experiences and individual learning styles;
2. Utilizing principles of adult education to actively engage students in the learning process;
3. Effectively using educational technologies to support learning, manage and post grades, and deliver hybrid and on-line courses;
4. Developing curriculum that uses appropriate strategies and tools to assess student learning;
5. Ensuring that course and program curriculum is current and relevant;
6. Working independently and demonstrating initiative; and
7. Working effectively with students, the program team and a variety of internal and external stakeholders.

The ideal candidate will meet or exceed the following qualifications:

1. A Master's degree in Nursing is the required credential for the position, in addition to appropriate Critical Care Certification. A Baccalaureate degree in Nursing in combination with a Masters of Education or a Masters of Health Science Degree would also be considered. PhD would be an asset.
2. A minimum of five years of recent and relevant clinical experience in critical care and acute health challenges.
3. Current registration in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario;
4. Teaching experience at the post-secondary level with a demonstrated application of adult educational principles, teaching/assessment methodologies and experience with hybrid and or online learning.
5. Use of technology to support student learning and managing grades;
6. Superior verbal and written communication and interpersonal skills, critical thinking and problem solving skills;
7. Committed to life-long learning;
8. Excellent organizational and time management skills;
9. Track record in meeting deadlines;

10. Self-motivated and independent worker who also functions well in a team environment;
11. Demonstrated ability to work effectively with a variety of stakeholders including students, other faculty members, support staff, administrators, other departments within the College and with external partners;
12. Understanding of the Ontario community college system;
13. Interest and/or experience in conducting research;

Preference will be given to candidates with relevant educational credentials and a proven track record of relevant work/teaching experience.
