

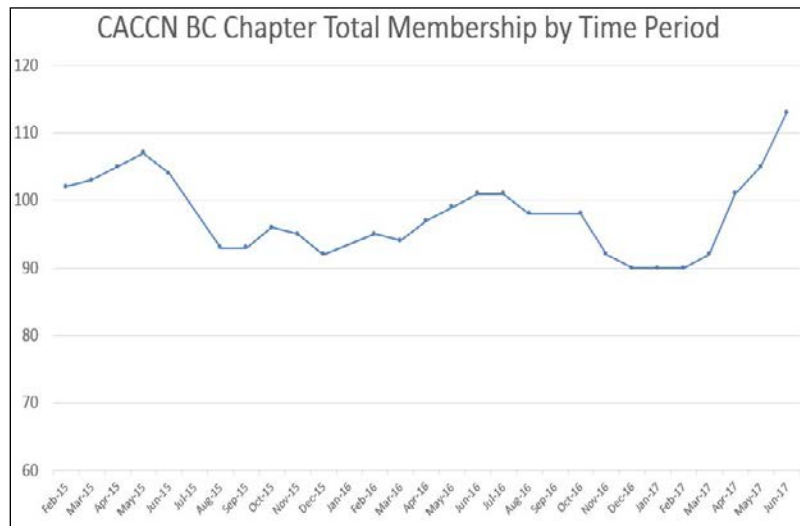
# BC Chapter Members Report

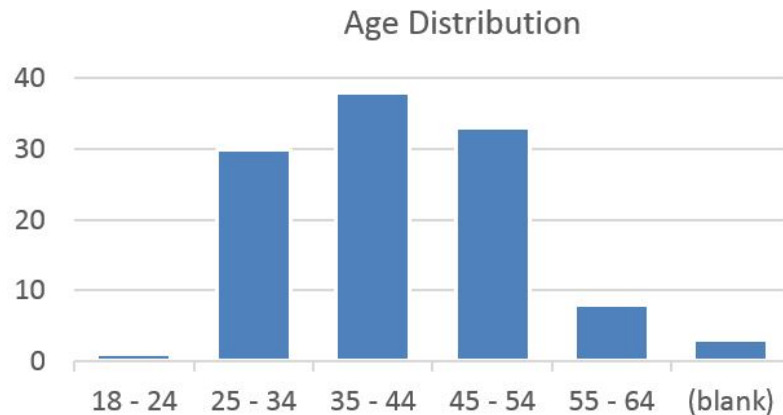


### Gender:

89% women & 11% men

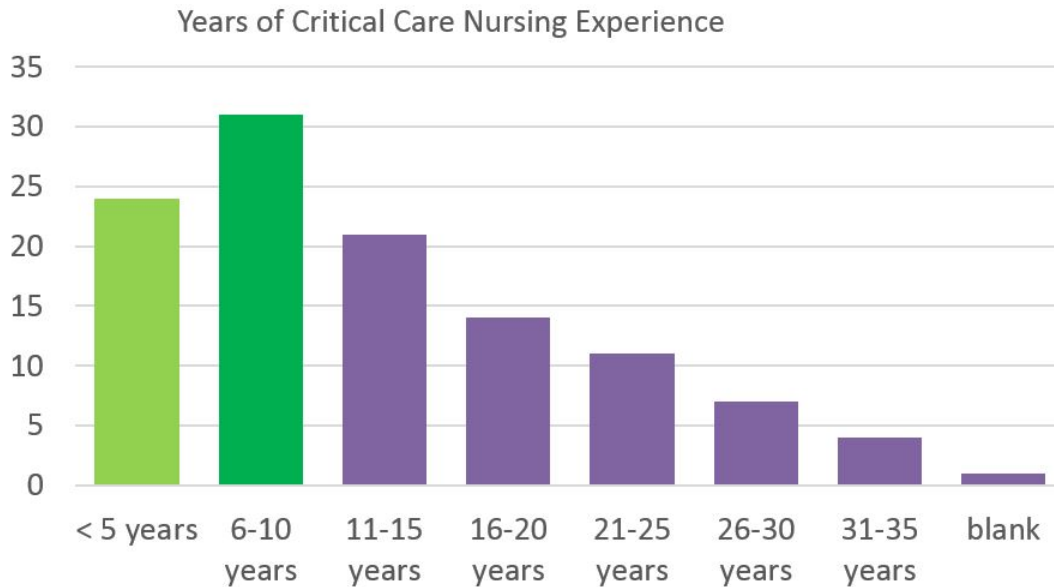
### Age:

Our members span all age groups but the largest age group (34%) are between the ages of 35-44, with both the age group and the 25-34 age group and the 45-54 age group making up 27% and 29% respectively. This is a slight change from last year, where the 35-44 age group made up 45% of our members.



### Years of Experience in Critical Care:

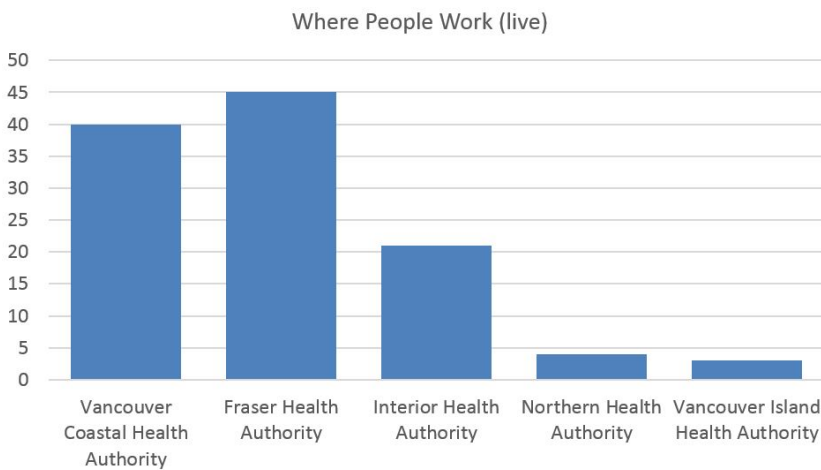

Based on city of residence therefore there is the risk of some error for people who live in Metro Vancouver area.

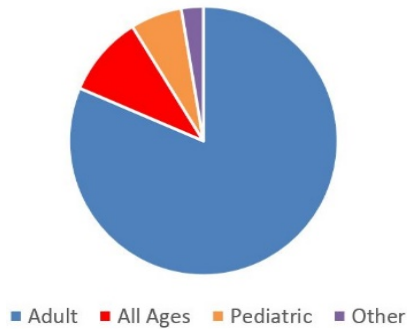
75% of our members live in the lower mainland either for VCH (35%) or FHA (40%).

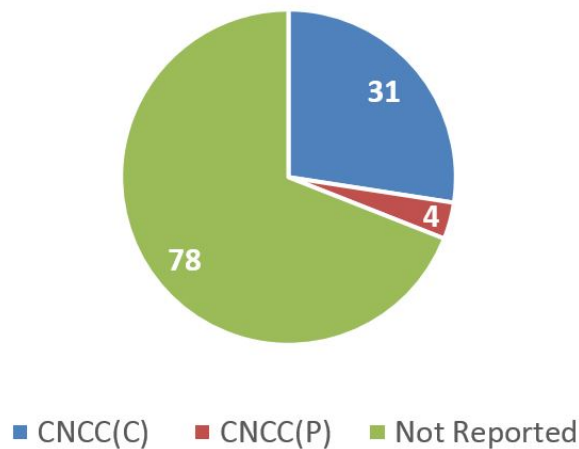
Most of our members are staff RNs (64%) or educators (22%). Over the past year we have seen an increase of members who report working in formal leadership roles (9%) and our numbers of members who report being a Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) in Critical Care remain the same – all of them!
